With a special outdoor concert on July 30!



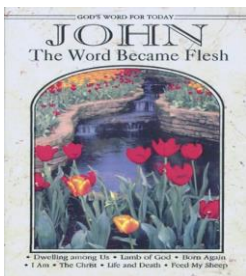

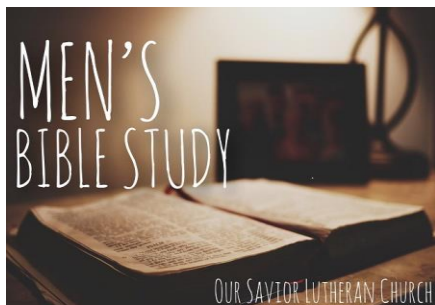
