


Additional Opportunity for Holy Communion


our Pastors and Elders are offering individual communion. Please contact the church office at 701-852-6404 to set up a time that would work best for you!

Sunday Morning Adult Bible Study




The Sunday Adult Bible Study takes an in-depth look at the Book of John and meets each Sunday at 9:30 am in the Great Room. Join us!

Wednesday Women's Bible Study





About Holy Communion at Our Savior Lutheran Church

Holy Communion is a special gift given by Jesus Christ to baptized believers. In preparation for the Lord's Supper you need to reflect upon the following questions:

1. Do I believe that I am a sinner in need of God's forgiveness?
2. Do I believe that Christ gives me His true body and blood in this sacrament for the forgiveness of my sins?
3. Do I promise, with the help of the Holy Spirit, to amend my sinful life?
4. Do I share a oneness in faith with the church body with which I am about to commune?

If you have difficulty answering "yes" to any of the above questions, please follow the guide of Scripture and wait to take communion today. Our Pastor would be glad to visit with you in preparation for the next time Holy Communion is offered.

Non-alcoholic wine is available for those with alcohol sensitivities.

Please signal your desire to the Pastor by briefly holding your hand in the "stop" position before receiving the cup. Gluten Free wafers are available.
